
Our Objective



Main Barriers to achievement for PPG pupils 2019/20

Many of the PPG pupils have lower literacy and maths skills than required for age related expectations.

Of the 5 pupils- 1 has an EHCP, 1 has additional SEN needs and 1 has English as a second language.

Impact of Expenditure on pupil outcomes

EYFS

At the end of the school year 2018-2019, pupils granted PPG achieved GLD (Good Level of Development) and all Early Learning Goals.

KS1

No eligible pupils sat the KS1 SATS.

KS2

At the end of the school year 2018-2019 there were 2 pupils eligible to sit the KS2 SATs. 1 pupil did not take the tests as he was working below the level of the test. The other pupil sat the KS2 tests, achieving the expected standard in Writing and greater depth in Maths. Despite considerable intervention, the pupil did not reach the expected standard within reading.

The two other pupils made progress in their learning during 2018-2019. This was evidenced in their books and the school's internal data.
