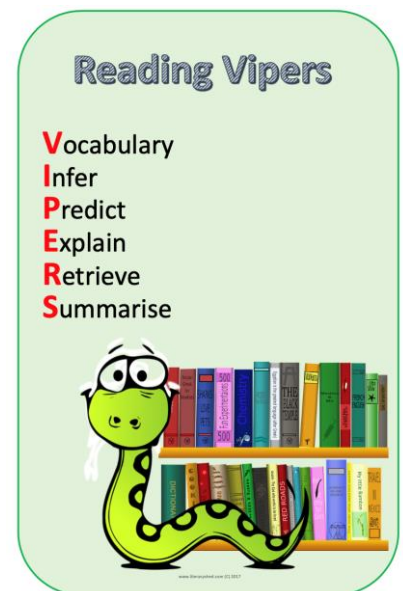

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Which word tells you that...? Why do we need to ask questions?

- To check the children's, understanding.
- To check they are pronouncing unfamiliar words correctly.
- To help them become more fluent.
- To help them understand unfamiliar vocabulary and what it means in the story.
- To spend some calm, quality time together, chatting about the book and the characters.
- To show you are interested in their reading.
- To enjoy a great book!
