

# **Pupil Premium Grant**

## **Report for Academic Year 2020/21**

**At Greenvale we strongly believe in enabling pupils to achieve their true potential in all areas of learning regardless of their different backgrounds.**

### **Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)**

The Pupil Premium is a government initiative that provides additional funding for pupils from deprived backgrounds, with research showing they can underachieve compared to their non-deprived peers. The premium is provided in order to support these pupils in reaching their potential.

The government provides this funding for a child who is identified as being;

- a) Currently entitled to free school meals (FSM)
- b) Pupils who have been entitled to free school meals in the last 6 years (Ever 6 FSM)
- c) Children Looked After (CLA) – pupils who are in the care of the Local Authority
- d) Adopted children who were once Looked After (Former CLA)
- e) Children who have one parent or more parents in the armed forces (Service pupil Premium)

The government has allocated a fixed amount of money to schools per pupils based on the number of pupils eligible, using the groupings above.

At Greenvale, we closely track the progress of children for whom we are in receipt of the Pupil Premium funding.

The Pupil Premium grant is a government initiative providing additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers.

### **Our Objective**

At Greenvale we have a commitment to raising achievement for all pupils in receipt of PPG to close the gap in achievement between them and their peers. We implement strategies to aim to accelerate progress. With a very small number of PPG pupils, interventions are carefully planned on a fairly individual basis to best meet the needs of each pupil.

Many of the PPG pupils have lower literacy and maths skills than required for age related expectations.

Of the 5 pupils- 1 has an EHCP, 1 has additional SEN needs and 1 has English as a second language.

## Additional factors

2 out of our 11 PPG pupils have additional needs. 1 child has an EHCP and 1 child has a SEND support plan.

Please note that some items outlined in this plan may be adapted to suit the restrictions placed on the school by Covid-19 safety measures. Pupil Premium funding for this academic year will be used to fund:

- An additional intervention teacher to be based in Year 2 during the Autumn Term of 2020 to enable pupils to close the gap. This intervention will specifically focus on phonics, English and Maths.
- 3 x weekly targeted support for Year 4 on basic skills in English carried out by intervention teacher.
- School counsellor - provides counselling and play therapy.
- Whole class texts, stationary and one set of uniform to be provided to families.
- The Arc Centre sessions
- Early morning maths sessions x 2 weekly

- Yr 6 intervention - Tuesday afternoons
- Additional 1:1 support provided for children with SEND
- 1:2 maths support sessions for Yr 6 run by DB.
- Listening and attention group in EYFS/Yr 1
- Supported breakfast club and after school sessions
- Free after school teacher led clubs.
