Parenting support...


I am pleased to announce the launch of a brand new book, written to support parents with the many challenges of parenting...

Attendance

Last year, our data showed a fairly significant drop in school attendance with a number of pupils being classified as a 'persistent absentee'. This applies to any children whose attendance falls below 90%. Quite simply, poor attendance has a significant impact on a child's outcomes both in school and in later life.

We therefore ask parents to support the school in getting the best for your children by ensuring that children have good and regular school attendance. This means that we request that holidays are taken during designated periods of school holiday. This is one of the reasons for providing you with the dates at the beginning of the year. Any application for term time absence must be put in writing and discussed with Mr Bowden in advance. There is very little discretion for any authorisation of term-time leave.

Reporting absence

We understand that children do get sick and that there will be times when it is not appropriate for them to be in school. We ask you to follow the following procedure:

- On each day of sickness, please email <u>absence@greenvale.croydon.sch.uk</u> before 8.50am to notify us of your child's name and reason for absence.
- 2. For any absence lasting any more than 3 days, we ask parents to seek medical advice.

A reminder that should a child have sickness or diarrhoea, that they remain absent for 48 hours since their last bout of either.



<u>Lateness</u>

Should a child be late, they must be accompanied by a parent or carer to the school office and sign in on the entrance system. A reason must be provided for any lateness.

Key Stage 2 Class Readers


In KS2 (Years 3-6) children will benefit significantly from having a copy of the class reader.

Please do check with the FOG bookshop as they may have copies for you to purchase at a cheaper price!



Stationery Requirements

Stationery - KS2 Pupils (Years 3-6)

From September, each child will require their own stationery in a **small** pencil case.

Children will require the following:

Two sharpened pencils

A rubber

A sharpener

A 15cm ruler

A glue stick

A green biro and a purple biro



At Greenvale, we pride ourselves on having high expectations. This applies in all areas of school life.

On days that the children have PE, they are to come to school in their PE kit. Your child's class teacher will inform you of their PE days in due course.

Key points to note:

- All children are expected to wear smart school shoes and not black trainers (of any kind).
- All socks should be ankle or knee high socks (no trainer socks).
- Earrings should be **plain studs**. If your child is unable to remove their own earrings they will be unable to take part in PE.
- Leggings are not part of our school uniform. If children choose to wear cycle type shorts for modesty, these must be black.
- Hair accessories must be subtle and red, black, grey or white in colour.
- Ensure that <u>ALL</u> items are named including uniform, water bottles, lunch boxes etc.

Can we please ask that parents and carers log into their child's Arbor account this week to make sure that all information is correct and up to date. In particular:

- Medical and allergy information
- Contact details and emergency phone numbers
- Adults authorised to collect your child from school (we will be unable to allow anyone who is NOT listed to collect your child)
- Photo consent

Wraparound Care Part 1

We hope to have the Arbor Pay booking system up and running very soon but in the meantime we will continue to use ParentPay for wraparound care payments. Robins will be provided with ParentPay login details in the week that they start school. Robins will be able to attend Breakfast Club and Afters from Monday 25th September. Please ensure that your ParentPay account is always in credit before using our wraparound services.

Breakfast Club

Booking

Currently, you do NOT need to book a place for your child at Breakfast Club in advance, however please inform breakfast club staff if your child is going to attend regularly on set days.

Sessions and Prices

Breakfast Club is open from 7:30am until 8:50am when school begins. From September the cost of Breakfast Club is £5.00 per session. Children can arrive anytime during the session however breakfast will only be served until 8:30am.

For safeguarding reasons you must sign your child in with Mrs Crier or Mrs Jutlay each morning by going to the Poppy room using the outside entrance through the Poppy garden.

Wraparound Care Part 2

Afters - After School Club

Booking

Currently, parents and carers must book a place for their child 48 hours in advance for Afters (with the exception of this week). Please text (do not call/leave a voice message as the phone signal is not strong enough) Nicci and Emma on 07745586212. There will no longer be any places available to book on the day. Please inform Nicci and Emma of the days that your child will be attending and the session time for each day in your text. If you require regular days each week please book these in as soon as possible.

Sessions & Prices

End of school - 4:30pm £6.00 (fruit will be available as a snack, children should not bring their own)

End of school - 6pm £12.00 (a light tea will be provided)

Collection

For safeguarding reasons you must sign your child out with Nicci or Emma each afternoon by going to the Poppy room using the outside entrance through the Poppy garden. Please wait outside the Poppy room door for your child to be brought out to you. Parents and carers should not enter the school building and should vacate the school grounds as soon as they have collected their child.

Food in School

Nut Free School

A reminder that we are a 'nut-free' school. We **DO NOT** allow nuts of **ANY** kind in **ANY** form! Please ensure there are no nut products in your child's lunch boxes for example: peanut butter sandwiches, chocolate spreads, cereal bars, some granola bars, This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely.

School Lunches

Further to our email sent on 19th July, we would like to remind parents/carers that school meals are free for all children this academic year. We encourage all of our parents/carers to take advantage of this.

Please click <u>here</u> to see the hot and cold menu options on the school website and discuss these with your child so that they know which meals to select each day. It is the parent/carers responsibility to keep all medical and allergy information up to date on Arbor and should you wish to discuss any of the menus regarding allergy information please contact our catering manager via the school office.

Robins parents/carers will be able to select their child's meal choice each morning on the board outside the Poppy garden.

Breaktime Fruit and Drink

KS1 children will be provided with fruit/vegetables on a daily basis but can choose to bring in their own fruit in a named container if they wish. KS2 children are required to bring their own fruit/vegetables for a breaktime snack in a named container if they wish. Grapes and cherries should be cut into small pieces and de-stoned.

Cool Milk

Milk is free for all children under the age of five but it is the parents/carers responsibility to register children for this service with Cool Milk. Milk is also free to children receiving or who are entitled to free school meals - please contact the school office to set this up if it applies to you. If children over the age of five wish to receive milk, parents/carers should register their children and pay for this service with Cool Milk.
